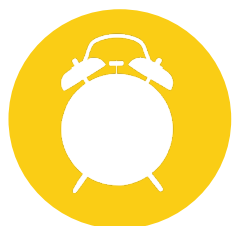

Elective Units

Choose 3 that are appropriate for your workplace, some require regular handling and care of specific species. Only choose units where you care for these species most days of the work week.

ACMVET202	Carry out daily practice routines (only students working in a veterinary practice)
ACMSPE316	Provide general care of domestic dogs
ACMSPE317	Provide general care of domestic cats
ACMSPE314	Provide general care of birds
ACMSPE322	Provide general care of rodents or rabbits

Entry Requirements

There are no specific pre-requisite knowledge required for entry, however you must:

- Have completed Year 10 or be a mature aged student
- Have a minimum of 8 hours per week of work in a veterinary clinic or animal care facility
- Have an email address, reliable internet access, and an ability to film yourself for assessment purposes
